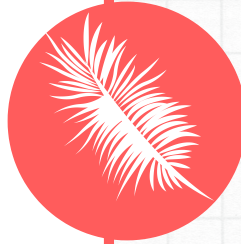
HOLY WEEK TIMELINE

WHAT IS HOLY WEEK?

Holy Week is the last week of the Christian season of Lent and a time of prayer and preparation for Easter.

PALM SUNDAY: JESUS RIDES INTO JERUSALEM.

Jesus rides into Jerusalem on the back of a donkey. He is greeted by crowds waving palm leaves and shouting "Hosanna!"



MONDAY OF HOLY WEEK: MARY'S GIFT TO JESUS.

Mary anoints the feet of Jesus with expensive oil.



TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK: BETRAYED

Jesus predicts that he will be betrayed and another of His disciples will deny Him three times.



WEDNESDAY OF HOLY WEEK: THIS IS MY BODY.

Jesus shares His Last Supper with His disciples. He takes the bread and blesses it saying: This is my body broken for you. He takes the cup of wine and blesses it saying: This is my blood poured out for you.





MAUNDY THURSDAY: JESUS WASHES THE DISCIPLES FEET.

During the Last Supper Jesus washes the feet of His disciples taking on the role of servant and teaching his disciples how to serve others.



GOOD FRIDAY: JESUS IS CRUCIFIED AND DIES ON THE CROSS

Jesus carries the heavy cross through the streets of Jerusalem to a place called Golgotha. In this place He is nailed to the cross and dies.



HOLY SATURDAY: THE WAITING DAY

For the first disciples this was a day of mourning, their friend and their teacher has been killed and now lies in the tomb.

For us today, it is a day of hopeful waiting, knowing that this is not the end of the story.

EASTER SUNDAY: HE IS RISEN!

Alleluia! Alleluia!
Jesus has risen from the dead.



Lectio Divina

God can speak to us through the Bible. And this is a way of reading the Bible which helps us to make space to hear what God is saying to us

Each day when you read the scripture passage for the day make the time to do it in this way. If it help write down your thoughts.

Lectio (Read)

1

Read for the first time. While you read pay attention to how it makes you feel and what stands out to you from what you have read/listened to.

Meditatio (Meditate)

Take a few moments in silence to meditate on what you have just heard. Think about what the story reminds you of, what you would do in this situation, and how you connect with the story.

2

Oratio (Pray)

Read the bible passage again and then after this second reading allow for silence. During this time of silence speak to God.

Contemplatio (Contemplate)

Read the passage from the Bible for the final time and allow for a time of silence again. During this silence take time to contemplate.

5th April 2020

Lectio Divina: 'Jesus rise into Jerusalem'

Jesus and His disciples arrived at the Mount of Olives just outside Jerusalem. He sent two of the disciples to the next village to collect a donkey and her foal. 'If anyone stops you, tell them that they are for me,' He said. They brought the animals to Jesus, and put cloaks on their backs so that Jesus could ride on them. When the people heard that Jesus was coming they laid their cloaks on the road before Him, and pulled branches off the palm trees to wave in the air. The crowds grew more and more excited and shouted at the top of their voices, 'Hosanna, Hosanna! Blessed is the one sent by the Lord.' Excitement filled the whole city, and some people asked, 'Who is this man?' The people answered them, 'It is Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.'



Hosanna! The people sang and shouted Hosanna as Jesus arrived into Jerusalem. Find a Hosanna song you could all sing or listen to together today.




Participate in Mass via a live stream. It could be your local Church or find a live stream for Liverpool Catholic Cathedral.

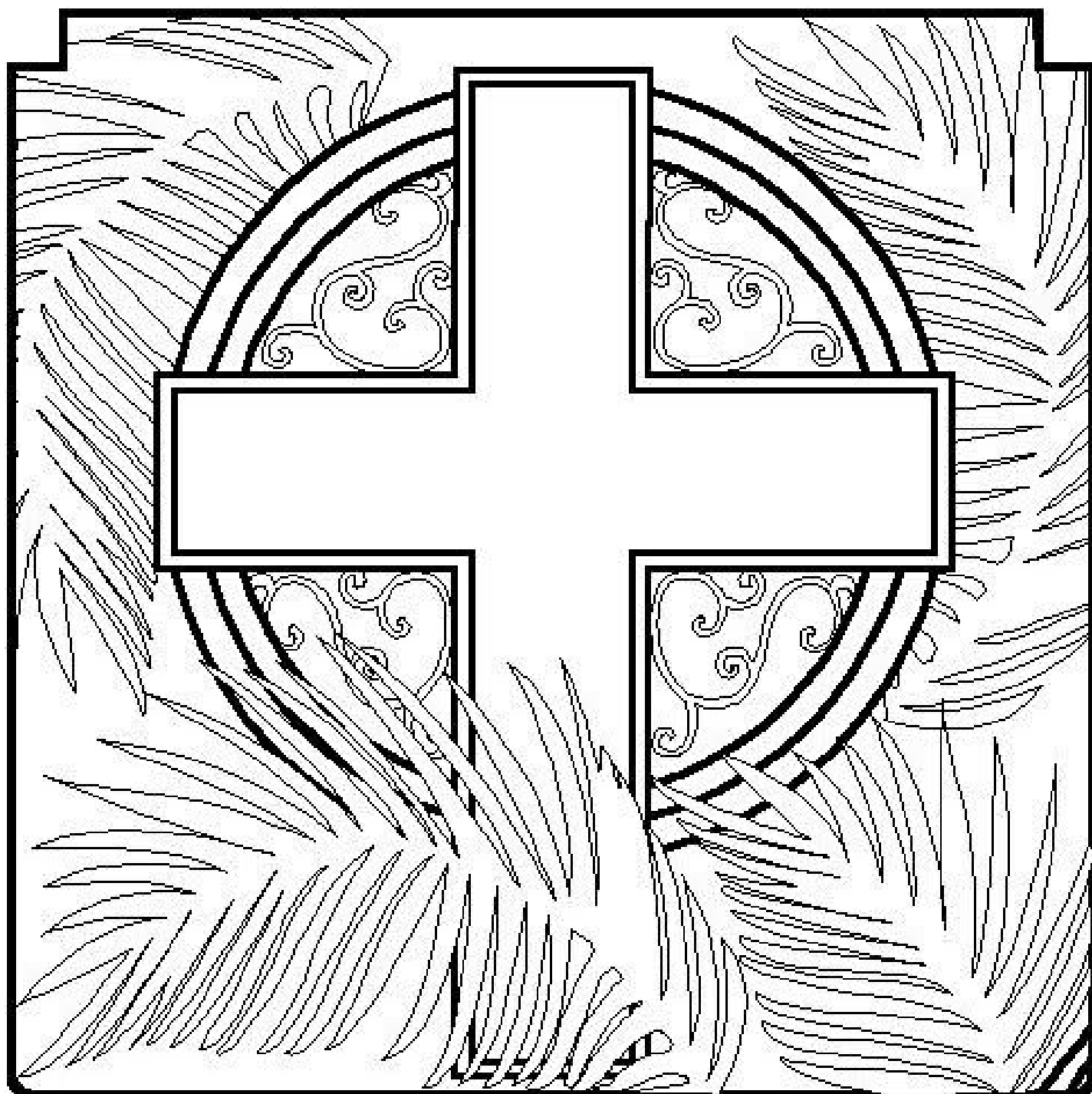

Mary has chosen wisely. You will always have the poor with you, but you will not always have me.'

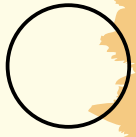

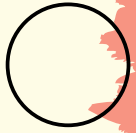

Lectio Divina: 'Betrayed'

As Jesus shared the Passover meal with His twelve closest friends He told them 'One of you will make me very sad tonight.'
The disciples were dismayed at His words. 'Surely you are mistaken, Lord!' But He answered, 'One of you sharing this very meal will hand me over to the enemies!'
'Lord, who will it be?' They asked.
'Whoever shares this bread with me,' He said, just as Judas Iscariot reached across and took a piece of bread from the same dish.
Then Jesus explained to His disciples that He would not be with them for much longer, and that they could not follow where He was going.
Peter said to him, 'Lord, I am ready to die for your sake!'
But Jesus told him that before the cockerel had crowed that same night, Peter would deny Him three times.

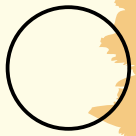

We don't always get it right and make mistakes from time to time. Write down things you are sorry for.



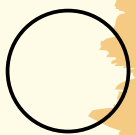

Then He took a cup of wine and said a prayer of thanks. He passed the cup to each of them and said, 'Take this and drink it, for this is my blood. Just as my Father promised, it will be poured out to save you from your sins.'

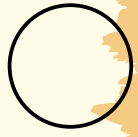

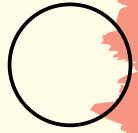

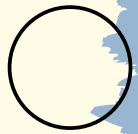
WEDNESDAY OF HOLY WEEK

Getting up from the table, He poured some water into a basin and, wrapping a towel around his waist, began to wash the feet of His disciples.

When it was Peter's turn he tried to stop Jesus by saying, 'Lord, it is not right that you should be washing my feet.'

But Jesus said to all of them, 'I, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet. I have shown you how it should be, so that you will go away and wash each other's feet.'

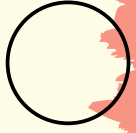

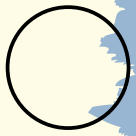

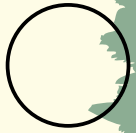
Jesus served His disciples by washing their feet before their meal. Serve your family today by wash up after each meal.



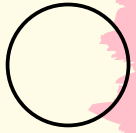

Write down ways you are going to serve others. Print off a calender for the month a write down one thing for each day that you can do to serves others.

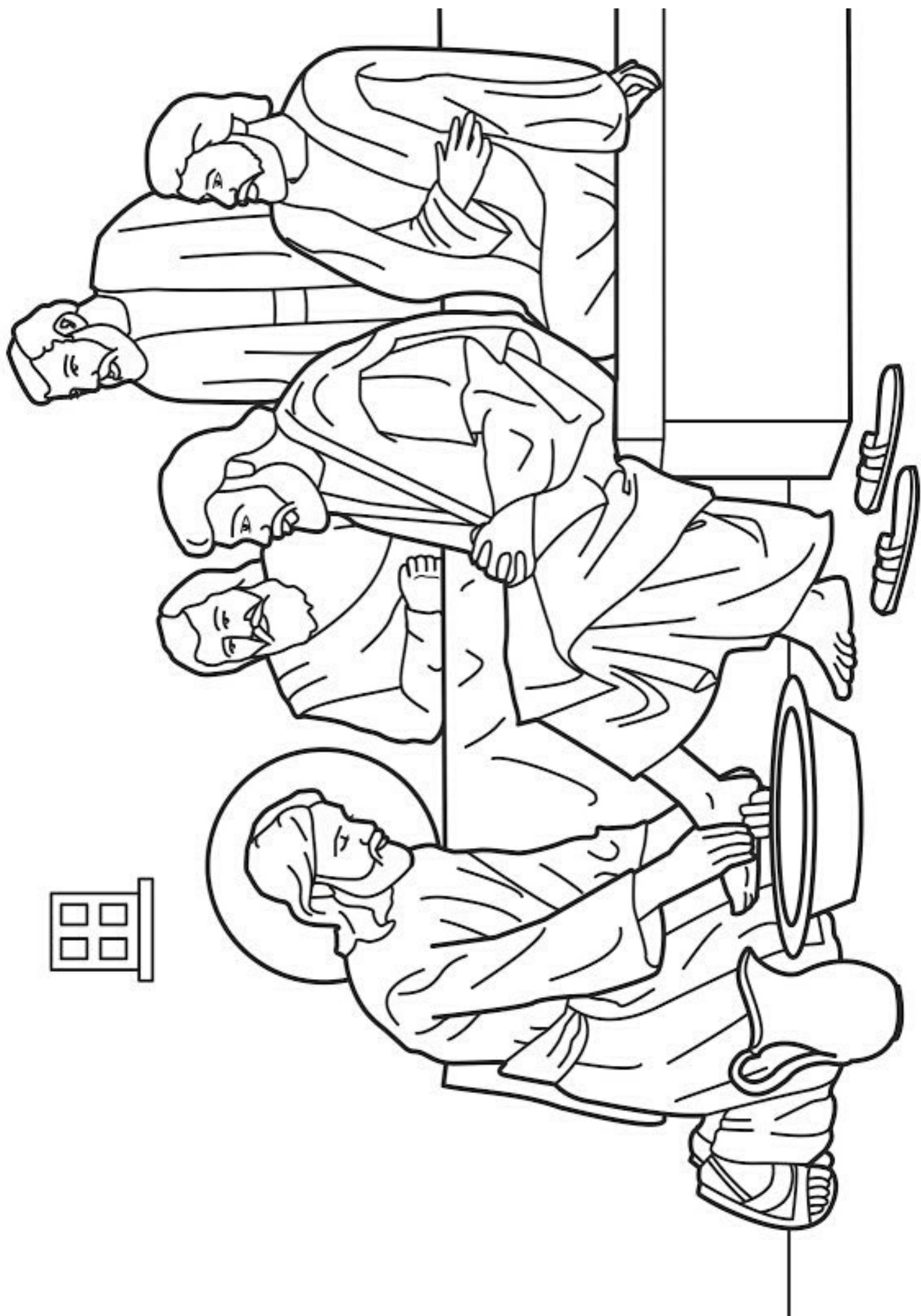

Lectio Divina: 'Jesus is put to death'

Jesus was taken before Caiaphas, the High Priest, and the elders. They decided that Jesus should be put to death, and they sent Him to be sentenced by the Roman governor, Pontius Pilate. Pilate was afraid that the crowds would cause trouble, so he agreed to crucify Jesus knowing that He had done nothing wrong. The Roman soldiers made fun of Jesus by making a crown of thorns for the 'King of the Jews'. Then they hurt Him and forced Him to carry his own cross. After Jesus had stumbled and fallen several times, the soldiers ordered a man called Simon to help Him.

When they got to Golgotha (a name which means 'the place of the skull'), they nailed Jesus to the cross and wrote above Him, 'This is the King of the Jews.' Two thieves were crucified next to Jesus, and they joined the crowd in mocking Jesus and His claim to be God's Son. 'He saved others, but he can't save himself!' they jeered.

After hanging on the cross for many hours, Jesus called out in a loud voice, 'Father why have you deserted me!' and then He died.

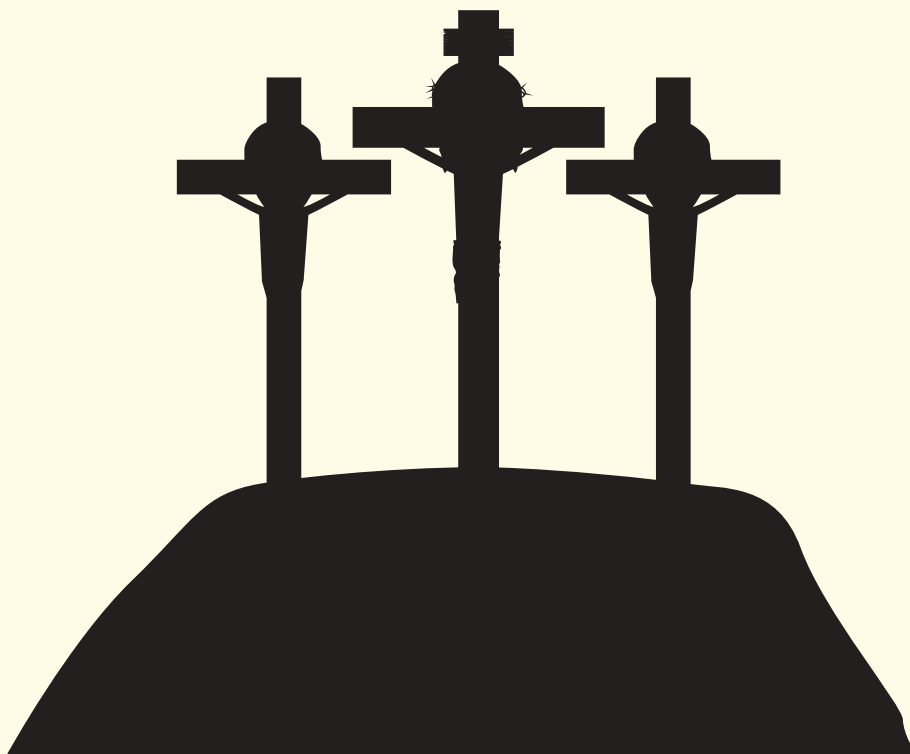
☐ Make a Cross out of things in your house. You could use toys or lego, or shoes, or sticks from the garden.

☐ Jesus paid the ultimate sacrifice for us. What could you sacrifice and go without today?



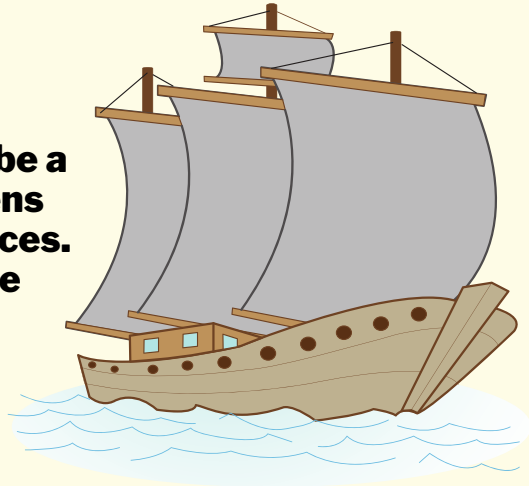


THE STORY OF THE THREE TREES



Three trees on a wooded hill were discussing their hopes and dreams. The first tree said, "Someday I hope to be a treasure chest. People could fill me with gold, silver and precious gems. They could decorate me with intricate carvings and everyone would see its beauty."

"The second tree said, "Someday I will be a mighty ship. I will take kings and queens across the seas and sail to unknown places. Everyone will feel safe because of the strength of my hull."



"Finally, the third tree said, "I want to grow to be the tallest and straightest tree in the forest. People will see me on top of a hill, look up to my branches and think of the heavens and God. They will remember me as the greatest tree of all time."

After years of praying that their dreams would come true, a group of woodsmen came upon the trees. One came to the first tree and said, "This looks like a strong tree. I can sell the wood to a carpenter." After being cut down, the tree was happy because he knew that the carpenter would make him into a treasure chest. At the second tree a woodsman said, "This looks like a strong tree. I can sell it to the shipyard." The second tree was happy because he knew he was on his way to becoming a mighty ship. When the woodsmen came upon the third tree, the tree was frightened because he knew that if they cut him down, his dreams would not come true. A woodsman said, "I don't need anything special from this tree so I'll just take it back with me."

"When the first tree arrived at the carpenters, they made it into a feed box for animals. It was then placed in a barn and filled with hay. They cut the second tree and made a small fishing boat. They cut the third tree into large pieces and left it alone in the dark.



The years went by, and the trees forgot their dreams. Then one day, a man and woman came to the barn. She gave birth and they placed the baby in the feed box made from the first tree. The tree could feel the importance of this event and knew that it had held the greatest treasure of all time.


Years later, a group of men got in the fishing boat made from the second tree. One man went to sleep. A great storm arose and the tree didn't think it was strong enough to keep the men safe. The men woke the sleeping man. He stood and said "Be calm" and the storm stopped. At this time, the tree knew that it had carried the King of Kings in its boat.



Finally, someone came and got the third tree. It was carried through the streets as the people mocked the man who was carrying it. Later, they nailed the man to the tree and raised him up to die at the top of a hill. On the third day, the tree came to realize that it was strong enough to stand at the top of the hill and be as close to God as was possible. Jesus had been crucified on it.

The moral is: When things are not going our way, know that God has a plan for us. God will do almost anything for us. Jesus reminded us through his teachings and his stories how much God loves us. Place your trust in God and God will always give you what is best for you.

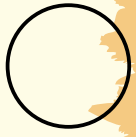

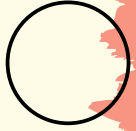

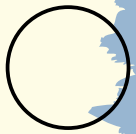
HOLY SATURDAY

Lectio Divina: 'Alleluia! Jesus is risen!'

Before sunrise on the Sunday morning, Mary of Magdala went to the tomb. As she reached the entrance, she saw that the stone had been rolled away and the tomb was empty. She ran to the disciples saying, 'They have taken the Lord from the tomb and we don't know where they have put him!'

Peter and another disciple, John, ran to the tomb and found it just as Mary had described, with the linen burial cloths lying on the ground. Peter went into the tomb first, and then John followed him.

Until this moment they had not understood the Scriptures which said, 'He must rise from the dead,' but now they saw, and they believed.

○ Tune in via live stream to an Easter Sunday Mass.

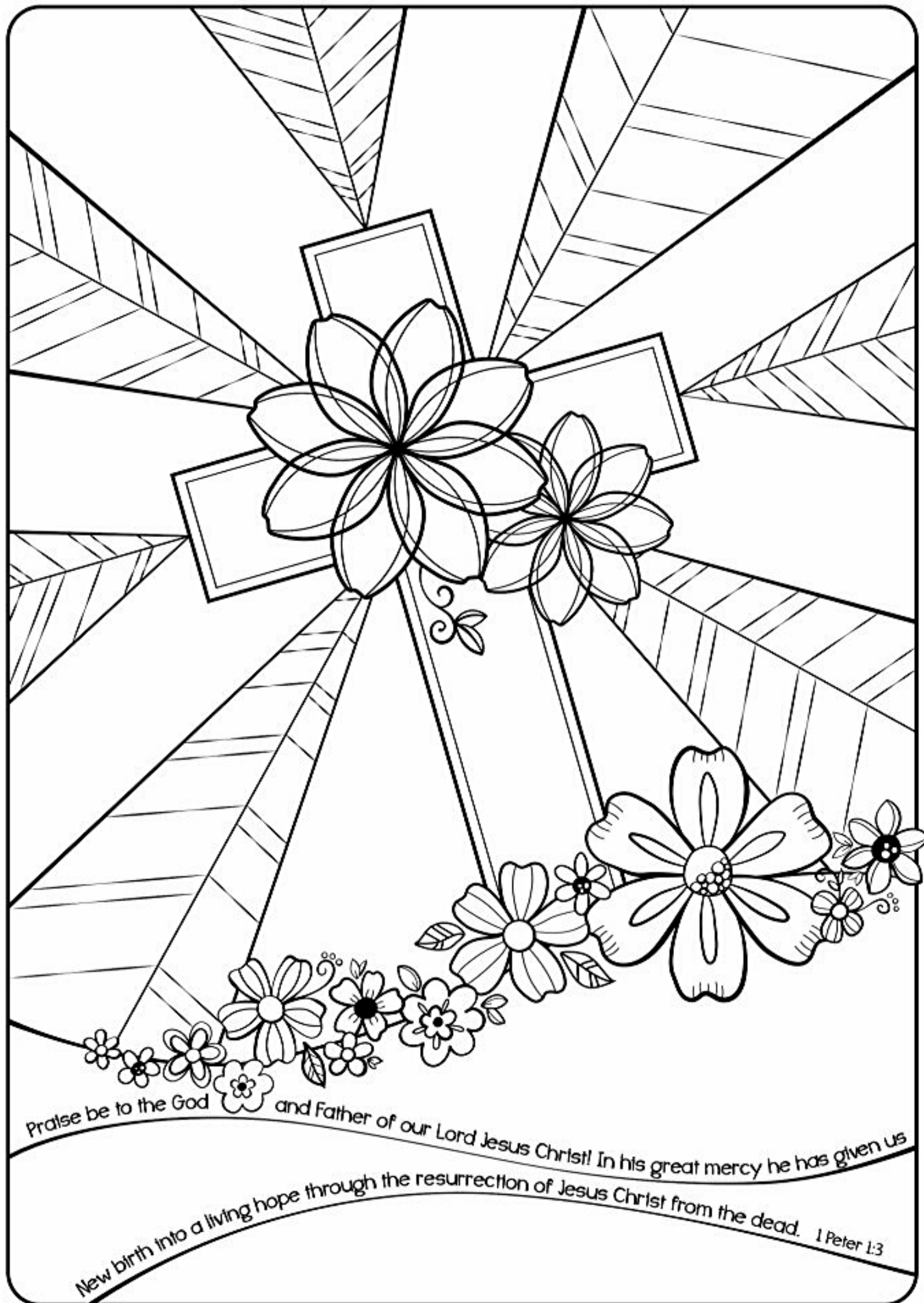
○ Set up an Easter egg hunt.

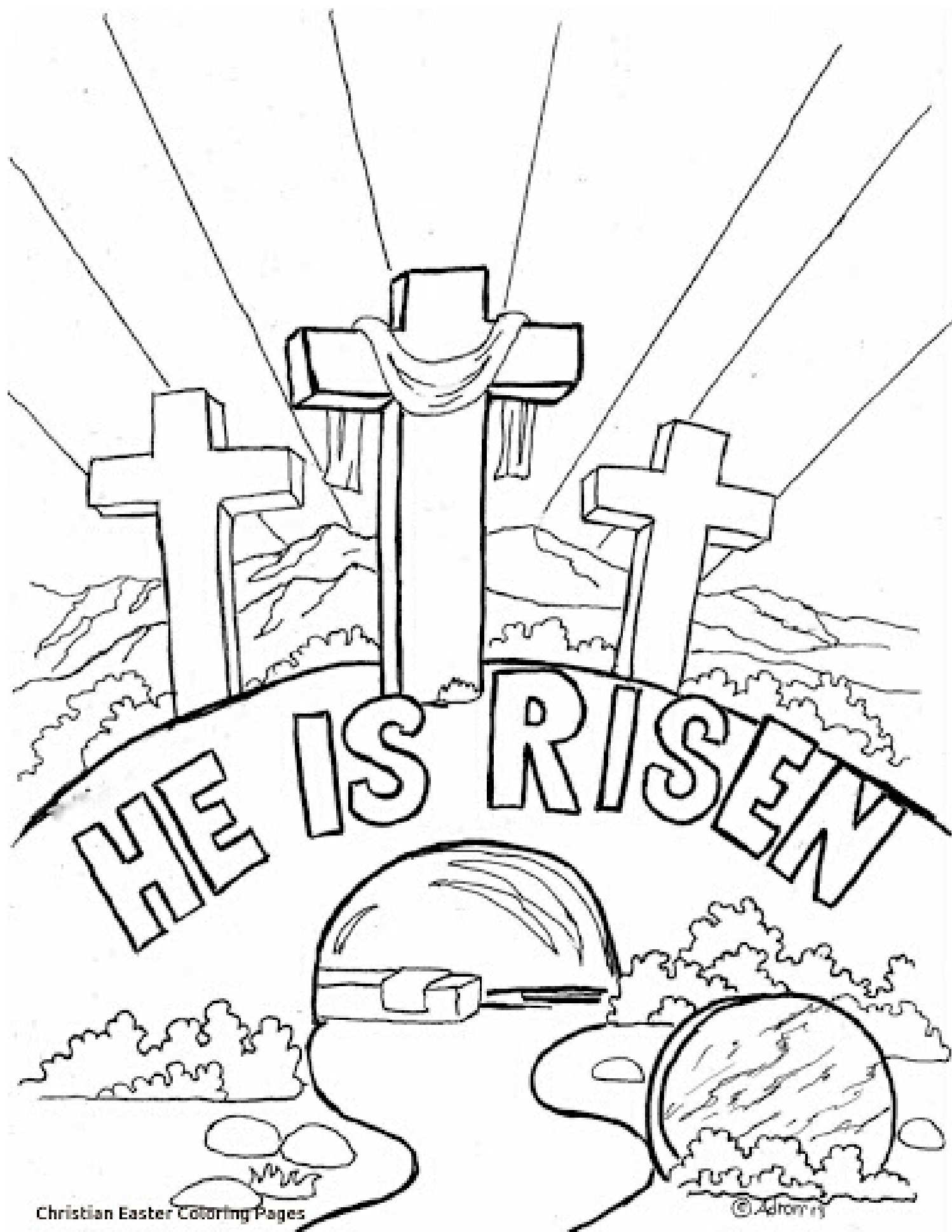
○ Have a Resurrection Party! Have a family lunch to celebrate Jesus rising from the dead! Make decorations and play party games together.
